A SKETCHBOOK FOR ALL SEASONS: NATURE JOURNALING TUTOR: SHARON FIELD

PLEASE BRING

- Name tag
- Coffee mug
- Plastic to cover your table
- Water bottle

MATERIAL LIST

- Sketchbook* stitched, not spiral bound
- Pigma Micron pens in black or sepia colour (Fine points sizes 005 and 003) *and/or*
- Copic Multiliner pens in black or grey or sepia colour (fine points)
- Paint brushes *and/or* a waterbrush
- Paper towel
- Coloured pencils in the colours that you normally use, *and/or*
- Watercolour paints and a palette
- Water container (for cleaning your brushes)
- A magnifying lens to help you see plant features
- Ruler
- A field guide to help identify plants (if you want!)
- A pad or a few loose sheets of watercolour paper hot pressed (smooth), which we will use to practice a few techniques.

*Sketchbook. A few important points:

- Your book should be about A5 size (and no bigger than A4!)
- It must have <u>at least</u> 60 sheets, which will give you about 120 pages
- It must be stitched (<u>not</u> spiral bound, because you might want to work across two pages for some of your drawings)
- The individual page size should be around 15 cm x 21 cm (so when the book is opened, you have a double page measure of roughly 30 x 21 cm).
- Make sure the paper is thick (at least 110 gsm in weight, or heavier) and suitable for pen and watercolour (if the paper is too thin, the pen and paint will bleed through the paper and crinkle it!)
- If you have particular plants or "treasures" from your own natural environment, bring them along to the class. Otherwise, we will find materials from close by the classroom to get you started.
