EXPLORING COLOUR WITH A LIMITED PALETTE

Tutor: Ann Rayment

Materials list

- Plastic to cover your table,
- Coffee mug
- Name tag
- **Acrylic paints** – I use Matisse. Liquitex or Atelier. Please bring heavy body artist quality paints if you can. If you can only afford student paints then try to get Chroma A2. Jo Sonya is too thin. I like to use a limited palette but it's nice to use secondary and tertiary colours amongst my primaries as well. Bring at least 1 warm and 1 cool of each colour. Colours below are just suggestions
 - Cool yellow - Hansa Yellow Light, lemon yellow, Aramalyde yellow light.
 - Warm yellow – cadmium yellow mid, Aramalyde yellow , yellow ochre
 - Cool Blue - pthalo Blue , cerulean blue, pthalo turquoise, Prussian blue.
 - Warm blue- ultra marine blue, purple.
 - Cool red - Quinacridone Magenta (or Primary Magenta). Brilliant magenta, Australian red gold
 - Warm red- pyrrole red, cadmium red, red ochre, vermillion
 - Transparent Colours- at least 2 colours
 - Australian Sienna
 - Transparent red oxide
 - Transparent umber
 - Quinacridone Magenta
- metal palette knife
- **Brushes:** Flat, round, filbert. Acrylic brushes. A large one (2 inch) , for washes, a flat 1 inch and other varying sizes.
- Flat smooth palette with no edges or disposable palette sheets are good.
- A4 art journal
- Sketching easel or table easel
- Water container
- Masking tape
- Paper towel
- Colour wheel-small is fine
- 2 Canvas' – 1 approx. 12"x12" and 1 larger (50x50cm)
- Gesso (or a cheap white paint)
- Acrylic medium

Materials fee: \$15 to be paid in cash to the tutor on the first day of the workshop
