Drawing Media

- lead pencil
- Water-soluble graphite stick
- Willow charcoal-thin stick like
- Oil pastels
- Posca pens (Acrylic paint pens)
- Black ink

Painting media

Bring the paints you have. Good to have warm and cool of each colour.

red, blue, yellow, white and black

Also good to have if you can- turquoise, purple, deep rose madder

Australian Sienna (Matisse), yellow ochre

- Brushes-1 soft wide brush for washes, wide bristly brush for large areas, smaller bristly house brush, Flat brush, round brush and cheap small bristly brushes, fan brush
- Palette knife
- 4 Sheets of either or all Watercolour, cardboard, Brown Kraft card (used for drawing-brown and approx 200 gsm)
- Coloured inks or liquid watercolour in a squirty bottle (about 3 colours at least-2 warm 1 cool or vice versa)
- Gesso
- Acrylic medium or pva glue

Printing Media

- **Jelly pad -recipe attached**
- **Rubber roller -Brayer**

General

- Canvases: 40x50, 50cmx60cm or any other size you wish (Not too big)-approx. 5
- Easel with backboard (50 x 70 cm))and clips
- Lots of cheap white drawing paper for mono-printing. Different textures
- Masking tape
- Tile or flat palette
- Rags
- Paper towel

- Wet ones
- Water spray bottle (Empty spray and wipe or similar)
- Drawing tools-Pipe cleaners feather Sticks from a gum tree –flexible and shaggy Cut up plastic or credit cards or wheat-bix box for laying paint and ink, straws, pipet, pipe cleaners
- Drop sheet (old tablecloth)
- Small bowls for ink washes
- Textured papers and material for mixed media – eg music sheets, old newspapers, text, hessian, gauze , string, tissue paper -white and Black and old pattern pieces*
- **A rustic still life object to add to the display (Vase flowers, blossom stick, kettle, jug, stool, old bottles , etc)**

Jelly pad Recipe

- Add 113g tub gelatin to the 1/2 cup (118 ml)of COLD water & one bottle of glycerin (178 ml) mixture
- Gently stir and pat out all the lumps and clumps
- Then add 1 1/2 cups (354 ml) of boiling HOT water to the mixture
- Gently and slowly stir to combine the fluids, pat out all lumps and clumps
- Finally add the last bottle of glycerin (178 ml) and gently stir.
- Pour into a 25x35cm (Approx)lamington tin or similar size plastic container with lid -Smooth bottom
- Wipe air bubbles with strip of newspaper.
- **Let it harden on the counter before** you try to move the pan
