Textured nuno-felt and Natural Dyes

Student requirement list

- Name tag
- Coffee mug plastic to cover your work table

- 4 meters of bubble wrap (120cm width best) Plus an extra piece 1 meter square
- Noodle and/or rolling stick, the width of your bubble wrap
- Stockings for tying your roll
- Pure liquid soap concentrate and sprinkling bottle
- One small piece of nylon netting approx .5m x 1m
- Three or four old towels
- 4 meters white paj silk 5.5 momie 114cm wide
- 200g Super fine white Merino wool (16 – 18 micron preferred)
- Available from Virginia Farm Woolworks, Kraftcolour, Nundle Woollen Mills.
- A length of tissue silk, silk fabric scraps, silk or other fibres such as banana, flax, soy (any colour) for exploring other fabric manipulation samples.
- Thin plastic sheet about the length and width of your garment e.g. painters drop sheet plastic
- Basic torso pattern in your size. This should be a simple sleeveless top dressmakers pattern. It is essential you have this as we won't have time to be drafting patterns.
- Tape measure & pins
- Scissors (small and large if you have them)
- Thread for tacking. This should be strong and smooth. Polyester upholstery thread is good. Long needle to use for tacking
- Note book and pencil or pen
- Bucket
- Old cup or glass jar and teaspoon for mixing dyes
- Rubber gloves
- Dressmakers mannequin if you have one. This is not totally necessary so please don't buy one especially for this workshop
- Please bring along a clothes airer if possible & some pegs. We need to dry felt quickly.
- We will need two or three sewing machines capable of doing a zig zag stitch and fitted with a size 12 sharp needle. Bring one if you can.
- If anyone has large dye pots or electric hotplate could you please ring them along.

- For the eco-print
- Bring along any leaves or plant material for the eco print you would like to try.
- Metal pipe (iron, galvanised, copper, brass) or wooden dowel to use as a core for the bundle. Iron should not be too rusty. Up to 30cm long and approximate diameter of a broom stick.
- Strong cotton string for tying bundle.

Pam could supply kits of 4 meters paj silk (\$48.00) and 200g fine wool tops (\$25.00) payable at the beginning of the workshop. Please order these well in advance of the workshop.

Pam will also supply the natural dye powders and necessary mordants at a cost of \$8.00.
