## TEXTILES AND FOUND OBJECTS

### Materials list

- Name tag
- Coffee mug

### Found Objects

- Students will need to bring a selection of small found objects to make into sculpture. Things such as wooden objects, plastic toys, aluminium or copper metal items, electrical parts, junk things from op shops and garage sales, branches, shells. Anything that you find interesting and you think may be able to be transformed into something else, is useful. Please choose objects that are easily drilled into and cut to make assemblage easier and quicker. Things with existing holes in them already are also quite useful.
- Note: Be aware that stainless steel, stone or glass items are difficult to cut and drill into with the tools we will have available.

### Textiles

- Please bring a selection of fabrics, yarns that you would like to use in your work. These can be found clothing, offcuts, or lengths. A cushion, a teddy bear, a cloth doll, whatever you feel might be fun to pull apart and rework into a sculpture.
- Bring, scissors to cut fabric, tape measure, pins, Long nose pliers
- A couple of long sewing needles (teddy bear making needles or beading needles are good) a couple of shorter needles, and thread.

### Assemblage Items

- A pair of safety glasses, dust mask, and wear enclosed shoes to the class.
- Measuring rule, and a fine tip permanent marker
- If you already have a Dremmel or similar please bring this along.
- 1 pair of long nose pliers that will cut and bend wire.
- Paper and pencil for jotting/drawing ideas.
- 2 x Arylehdyte glue (5 minute setting time), and any other glue you think you might need for the particular objects that you bring.
- Paper and pencil for jotting ideas.
- A section of wood ply-board or similar that can be used as a work surface, about 50cm x 50cm. Bring two clamps to clamp this to the tabletop. The wood is so we don't drill into the tabletops.
- A power drill if you have one,

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- Drill bits of a range of sizes (ranging from 1mm up to 10 mm)
- 3.3mm (#30) drill bit for drilling rivet holes.
- If you already have a Dremmel (and fittings) or multi tool please bring along.
- Containers, rags, paddle pop sticks and toothpicks for mixing glues.

**The following things: the tutor will bring her tools to share, but if you have your own and can bring them please do:**

- a couple of small clamps, a rivet gun,
- a sharp mitre or tenon saw, a hack saw, a claw hammer, a little ball peen hammer, a fine metal file, screwdrivers of a few sizes, a jewellers hand drill
- tinsnips, stanley knife, centre-punch, a fine tip permanent marker
