Info notes provided for making Encaustic Wax & set up for use at home. Learn application of materials and handling of equipment, tools etc. Experiment with imbedding onto board, dipping, fusing, incising, stencils, collage, image transfer, shellac burn, adding colour and texture with mixed media techniques giving you few different artworks to take home *All levels*

BIO Born with a creative spirit and a natural passion for light and colour, Jacki experimented with numerous artistic methods which led her to be immersed in the versatile and ancient Encaustic Wax medium. Jacki has worked with other artists O/S and has developed her own contemporary style over the last fifteen years. It is unlike any other painting medium with a dynamic quality through numerous techniques and combinations of mixed media.

ONE BRUSHSTROKE

An introduction to the skills and philosophy of Sumi-e painting.

Participants will learn to describe nature with a few brushstrokes and the 'colours' of black ink and water.

We will also observe the environment in the vicinity of our workshop through sketching.

The two day workshop will provide a grounding in brush use and posture, the meditative approach, and the unique qualities of the oriental ink and absorbent papers. *All levels*

4 Day | Monday 9 - Thursday 12 September 2024

MOUNTAIN AND TREE

This workshop will be suited to people who have a keen interest and/ or experience in ink brush painting Using one brush, plus black ink and water, we will develop techniques for the painting of local flora, fauna and landscape. This will involve practice of brush techniques, sketching, and a willingness to do some basic mindfulness exercises.

Our concern will be to paint directly to capture the spirit of the subject.

Haiku poetry will also be an inspiration for our final works which will be attempted on oriental papers.

All levels

BIO I have always loved painting and drawing, with a particular interest in oriental painting with its vibrancy, calligraphic line and use of space.

Attending classes by Andre Sollier, a master Sumi painter in the 1980s, led me to the disciplined and contemplative approach of Japanese painting. Further study with calligrapher-painter Richard Liddicut led to ongoing practice.

I paint with reverence for the skills and traditions of Sumi painting,

feeling drawn to the forms of our landscape from the sculptural forms of trees, to the calligraphy of gum leaves and the movement of insects.

This Sumi medium is utterly humbling, always insisting on presence with a meditative approach. I enjoy introducing this medium to others and encouraging play and skill development with ink.

A SKETCHBOOK FOR ALL SEASONS: NATURE JOURNALING

With a focus on the environment, you will set up your own Sketchbook for All Seasons, or perpetual journal. You will practice techniques for use in your journal before starting to draw in your own journal. This is a great way for you to learn more about your own natural environment and for improving your observational and drawing skills. *All levels*

4 Day | Monday 9 - Thursday 12 September 2024

GRAPHITE DRAWING ON STEROIDS

This workshop is designed to take the work of people who are already fairly experienced in using graphite to a new level of finish in their work. We will work on drawings that they have either completed or that are almost finished, so having multiple drawings will be important. We will <u>not</u> be starting a drawing from scratch. *Intermediate/Advance*

BIO Sharon began her botanical art career in 2009 and has exhibited in Australia, London and the United States, with one of her works travelling for 18 months in a touring exhibition around the USA. She is on the Board of the American Society of Botanical Artists.

Sharon has held 11 solo exhibitions and has participated in many group exhibitions in Australia and overseas, winning a number of awards along the way.

Working primarily in watercolour and graphite, she has also explored nature journaling using pen and watercolour and is currently working on a major piece that is gaining interest internationally.

PAINTING LANDSCAPES

This workshop is designed to develop and push your painting skills. Working with the inspiring Grampian landscape you will focus on completing at least one larger painting. We will start by collecting painting resources and developing engaging compositions with sketching and photographs. This will be an absorbing week where Alicja will work one on one throughout the process with you.

Intermediate/Advance

BIO Alicja's expressive oil paintings are a response to the play of light across land. The combination of large gestural marks and bold use of colour leads you on a journey into the landscape whilst still exploring the nature of the medium. The brushwork in these pieces is loose and expressive. The layers of paint are varied and built up with strong colours that eventually give way to the softer tones of nature, just hinting at what lies beneath. The individual brush marks are varied in weight and importance, thus creating movement, and giving life to these scenes.

CONTEMPORARY WATERCOLOUR

Join artist Stefan Gevers for this contemporary watercolour workshop for beginners. The focus is on learning basic watercolour skills with a contemporary approach and work with the surrounding landscape as inspiration in a creative, non-traditional manner.

This workshop will focus on techniques but also experimental methods, brush handling, colour mixing and applying washes. The objective is to give you the experience to move into the intermediate/ advanced level workshop, but will also give you enough knowledge to paint independently. *Beginners*

4 Day | Monday 9 - Thursday 12 September 2024

CONTEMPORARY WATERCOLOUR LANDSCAPE

Join artist Stefan Gevers for this contemporary watercolour landscape workshop. The focus is on learning to use watercolour with a contemporary approach and work with the landscape in a creative, non-traditional manner. Students will be using the Grampians as a source of inspiration.

This workshop will also focus in depth on watercolour skills, experimental methods, brush handling, colour mixing, applying washes. The objective is to give you the experience to work independently and start developing your own unique personal style, or for those with more experience, extend on your current practice and take it to the next level. You are expected to know the basics of how to use watercolour. If not, the 2 - Day workshop is for beginners. Intermediate/Advance

BIO Stefan Gevers takes a contemporary approach to working with watercolour. His work is inspired by many road trips through country Australia and his interest in the natural environment & delicate shifting patterns in nature are often a starting point for his work. Inspired by timing, repetition and movement and the inherent patterns within that. While most paintings are abstract or abstracted, it refers to the landscape and retains a strong figurative link and a defined horizon line.

Stefan's work has been collected by the Victorian & Queensland State Libraries, Artbank the NAB collection, Peter McCallum and numerous private collections throughout Australia and Europe.

Stefan exhibits widely as a solo artist and as part of collaborative exhibitions.

LOOKING FOR THE PICTURE WITHIN THE SCENE

Seeing the painting before you start. Do you start out on a journey without checking the map, the weather, or your gear before you depart? Set yourself up for success with thoughtful planning before you pick up your brushes. Painting is divided into two parts. First the Concept, second the Technique.

Planning the composition, deciding on the tonal values with rapid sketching, and colour esquisses. What techniques to use to get the result you want. We will study the 3 attributes of colour, colour perspective, and the use of complementary colours. Working quickly with limited time can be challenging but it is the best way to encourage spontaneity, freshness and looseness, leaving out unnecessary detail. After all watercolour is a medium that must be worked quickly and boldly. *All levels*

4 Day | Monday 9 – Thursday 12 September 2024

SEEING THE 'DIFFERENT' PICTURE

When you find your picture and have a clear plan of what you want to express, the motif, the mood and the atmosphere, you reach into your kit bag of techniques to choose how you are going to paint it.

Each day of the four day programme will see the class completing at least two paintings a day. Perspective, scaling and the creation of distance. I'll show you how to get your perspective right and it will give your painting the professional look. This workshop guide students to create in their own style with 'brush in hand' most of the time - less talking, more painting! Some laughing. *Intermediate*

BIO John Haycraft has been a professional artist since 1971, a principal of the architectural illustration firm Haycraft Duloy since 1974, lecturer, exhibitor and author of three books of paintings and drawings.

An experienced tutor and workshop leader, John teaches throughout Australia and conducts workshops overseas. A collection of his architectural drawings is held in the Mitchell Library, the State Library of New South Wales.

He has travelled and painted extensively in Europe, Asia and Africa as well as frequent painting trips to the outback of Australia and New Zealand.

Studied with Australian artist Lloyd Rees, American watercolourist Charles Reid, Joseph Zbukvic, and Eugen Chisnicean. There have been numerous joint exhibitions and three solo shows of his work. His paintings hang in private collections throughout the world.

SKETCHING AND PAINTING WITH IPAD AND PROCREATE

Discover the iPad and Procreate as a sketchbook and powerful aid to broaden your art-making practice. We begin with a quick review of what people already know about their iPad, Apple stylus and Procreate before learning the minimum tools and methods you'll need to use Procreate as a sketchbook. We cover working with a range of brushes, erasers, and the basics of the colour palette and layers. In the afternoon it's learning by doing as we head into the inspiring Botanic Gardens for a practical session of iPad sketch-booking. Day two we extend our skills into basic editing and working with photographs. Then we head out again for a walk-n-draw to the beautiful Venus Baths. The day wraps up with skills to help you make use of your iPad creations; exporting and sharing images and options for publishing, printing, painting and drawing from your images. *Aimed at iPad and Procreate Beginners*

Required for this workshop: iPad, Apple Stylus and Procreate software. **Relative fitness:** physically capable of low intensity bushwalking.

4 Day | Monday 9 - Thursday 12 September 2024

FROM DRAWING TO PAINTING - FINDING YOUR OWN WAY

For artists keen to explore expressive and abstracted art-making beyond representation.

Built around Paul's inspiring drawing and painting practice and philosophy the workshop emphasises, exploration, experimentation, risk taking and persistence on the exciting journey to find your own unique art making approach. Exploration is prized over perfection.

We create through drawing and painting in mixed media and acrylic with inspiration from the landscape and memory. Weather permitting, we will do some en plein air studies as inspiration too. Colour plays an important role in Paul's work so a key component of the workshop will be a review of colour basics and approaches to bringing colour to life in your work. *All levels*

Artists who participate in the 2-day iPad workshop will be well suited to continue into the 4-days using their iPad creations as starting points for further work.

BIO Over the past 40 years Paul Macklin has made an exploratory journey from drawing to painting and from representation to abstraction. His creative path is rich with joy, struggle and discovery. His workshops shine light on the key practical and creative insights of Paul's approach and give students pathways to build their own creative approach as a foundation for stronger, more expressive art-making.

We will also explore mixed media materials such as acrylic paints, gesso and texture mediums, paper ephemera, graphic markers, water soluble pastels, oil pastels and more. We will create a handmade sketchbook full of ideas and a series of resolved abstract landscapes. *All levels*

BIO Rachel Moodie is an artist, designer and multifaceted creative based in the NSW Southern Highlands.

She has a degree in Fine Art from UNSW and a background in arts marketing and graphic design. Her artworks are predominantly mixed media and collage, and she has exhibited locally and interstate since 2007.

Rachel has published a book on motherhood and creativity called 'The Artful Mum'. She is also the host of a podcast called 'Casting the Inner Critic', interviewing artists, writers, musicians, psychologists and more about their critical internal voices and the ways they overcome them.

We will work in larger format A4 sketchbooks and use both water soluble and waterproof pens, markers and watercolour. We will be opportunistic and draw our 'free models' wherever we find them but will also work with clothed models in the studio. *All levels*

BIO Deb's contemporary art practice is 30 years young and involves drawing, painting, public art and small sculpture. Deb's work has been built around the search for collected personal objects and curated public museum collections which can become metaphors for shifting memory, collections, and value. She holds a Bachelor of Fine Art from Queensland College of Art and has had 19 solo shows and been involved in more than 70 group shows in both regional and commercial galleries. LANDSCAPE IN WATERCOLOUR

This workshop is for watercolour painters who are seeking a quick direct approach. The workshop will concentrate on rural and bush landscapes. The workshop is designed for artists who want to advance their current skills to a new level and get the most out of their watercolour painting. **Advanced**

4 Day | Monday 9 – Thursday 12 September 2024

LANDSCAPE IN WATER BASED MEDIUMS

Concentrating on tone, shape and colour this workshop in watercolour, acrylic etc (anything that you can mix with water!) will explore Herman's quick and direct approach to painting. Go on a step by step journey through Herman's style of water-based painting, including plein air. This workshop is for artists to advance to a new level of competence in watercolours. *Advanced*

BIO Born in Melbourne in 1956 of Dutch parents, the art teachers of Herman's youth, Roger Webber, Ernest Buckmaster and Lance McNeill were all primarily oil painters, but the experience of painting with them on location left a strong impression on Herman, giving him the freedom of spontaneity and leaving him an intuitive painter, ultimately working from the light source.

Herman painted spasmodically until 1981 before commencing a Fine Arts degree at RMIT and studying under Dale Hickey and Jeff Makin. Like many young artists Herman experimented for a time with abstract expressionism, but he is now well known for his oils and watercolours. Herman is an artist of energy and enthusiasm. He is able to see a painting in almost any subject matter and is capable of producing award winning work in oil, watercolour or gouache.

Environmental issues are a great concern to Herman and his love of the landscape reflects that in almost everything he paints. He produces paintings of strong design and powerful impact - every brushstroke vibrant and visible. The scope of Herman's work has ranged from dynamic industrial scenery to soft, draped interiors and broad Australian landscapes, which indicates the creatively fearless nature of this unique artist.

You will be guided from start to finish on how to produce beautiful still lifes and/or flower paintings, learning techniques and tips along the way. BIO Megan Seres is a multi-award winning artist with a BFA H1 at NAS, Sydney. Megan has exhibited in group and solo shows and has been both recipient and finalist in many art awards. Her work is held in numerous private and public collections including Adderton House Museum, Australian Standfirst, Moran Arts Foundation, Redlands and Southern Star Pictures.

ABSTRACT LANDSCAPES

Revitalise your painting practice and expand your visual vocabulary of landscape abstraction. From sketching outdoors and looking towards nature, you will plan compositions, gather mark making techniques and these that be applied to paintings on wooden boards. Once painting we will draw inspiration from the sketches but paint intuitively, reacting to shapes, marks, colour and composition to give balance and harmony. We will be also using stencilling to give an extra dimension to the work. For those wanted to etch into the boards, we will use the wood burning kit. Texture, layering, colour mixing and having fun are the main elements of this workshop. *Introduction/intermediate*

4 Day | Monday 9 – Thursday 12 September 2024

ABSTRACTION AND LANDSCAPE PAINTING

Compared to the two days workshop, the 4 day workshop will allow artists to do more comprehensive sketches outdoors, from fast sketches to more detailed work. These can be used as reference works for many years to come. In the 4 day workshop we will paint a few works at the same time to allow a relationship to happen between the works but also let us constantly work on a piece while another dries.

Intermediate

BIO Zoe Sernack's imagined landscapes reflect the forms of nature above and below the surface, weaving together observation, memory and sensory experiences of place.

She holds a Bachelor of Fine Arts from The National Art School and has been a finalist in many art prizes such as the Salon De Refuses (Wynne), Fisher's Ghost Award, Hornsby Art Award, Gosford Art Award, Into the Light Art Award and the Lethbridge 20000 Art Award.

A keen observer, she is often found sketching plants in Sydney gardens and parks. Working on timber boards, she uses a delicate colour palette, carving and textural mark-making to capture the rhythms of the Australian bush seen with the eyes and felt with the heart. Zoes' objective has never been to depict but to evoke a visual connection. Whether it be a sense of place, a feeling or a memory.

Practicing for 28 years with some 75 exhibitions under her belt, Zoe is established in her practice and this will be a lifetime journey.

BIO Gary's background is in printmaking with particular interest in the relief print and working on various paper types, including Asian varieties. Images are responses to different sites, often abstract, and revealing an essence of place. Research sites include the Blue Mountains and Brisbane Water National Parks in NSW, and places further afield in Northern Australia, Greece, Spain, Italy and Thailand.

Since graduating from COFA, University of NSW in 2004, he has been exhibiting prints and mixed media works on paper regularly. His works have been acquired for public and private collections in Australia and overseas.

We will look at how colour helps us express how we feel about what we paint. The workshop will focus on acrylic paints.

Using versatile acrylic paints we will go step by step through the process of developing exploratory sketches and studies into finished paintings.

INTRODUCTION TO MIXED MEDIA


